Upon his retirement from elected office he founded the Manning Foundation for Democratic Education and the Manning Centre for Building Democracy, not-for-profit organizations dedicated to strengthening Canadian democracy in accordance with conservative principles. Manning has received the Queen's Privy Council for Canada, The Order of Canada, and the Alberta Order of Excellence.
